Legal confirmation of non-objection

Duty to Refrain, prohibition of competition

1. The Author assures that the services rendered by him in connection with the further planning, preparation, realisation and support of the work, and the third-party original texts and/or pictures obtained by the Author himself do not infringe third-party rights, that he is solely authorised to dispose of any and all rights to use under copyright law existing in the services rendered and/or in the aforementioned original texts and/or pictures, and that he has hitherto neither wholly nor partly made a disposition which conflicts with the granting of rights.
2. If the Author is, for legal reasons, prevented from making one of the assurances set out in section 1 above, or if the Author has doubts about his authority in this respect, he shall inform the publishing company without undue delay as soon as he becomes aware of the actual or suspected legal impediment.

Right in the company/right to title/granting of rights

1. All rights to use under copyright law and other rights to use in the work, including individual contributions by the Author, shall lie exclusively with the publishing company without limitation. This equally applies to the so-called right to an established and active right in the company and to any right in the title of the work in the terms of section 5 of the Trademark Act.
2. The Author hereby transfers to the publishing company for the duration of the statutory copyright and without geographic restrictions, the exclusive right to reproduce, distribute and rent out the work (publishing right), including the right to reproduce the work in non-physical media, and the right to make the work publicly accessible for individual retrieval. In particular, the publishing company is entitled to store the work electronically on any data media (e.g. hard disk, diskette, CD, DVD, mini-disk, cassette) in analogue or digital form and is entitled to include the work in its own databases or third-party databases, to distribute the data media and databases or pass on the work by remote data transmission or on the Internet or Intranets using any technical method. The publishing company may also make the contribution available for retrieval, itself or through a third party, in respect of all editions and transmission processes without limitation of the number of units or for retrieval any number of times, also in respect of all printed or electronic issues in physical or non-physical form. The publishing company shall be entitled to transfer rights of use, wholly or partly, to third parties.
3. Within the framework of section 2 above, the Author further grants the publishing company, for the duration of the primary right, the following rights of reproduction and distribution, including rights to reproduction in non-physical media, as exclusive subsidiary rights:
 - a) the right to wholly or partly preprint and reprint the work, also in books, newspapers and journals, as well as in the form of a special print;
 - b) the right to translate the work into other languages, and to make summaries (abstracts) of the work;
 - c) the right to record the work on video and/or audio recording media, including audio cassettes, also for exclusive use by blind and visually impaired people, and the right to play back the recording publicly, also in the context of multimedia products;
 - d) the right to reproduce the work in other forms, particularly by photomechanical and similar processes (e.g. photocopy, fax copy);

e) the right to reproduce and distribute the work in the context of a public offering and scheduled operation of a so-called "copy dispatch on demand" process;

f) the right to reproduce the work or parts thereof publicly through radio or television broadcasts;

g) the right to grant licences to third parties for exercising subsidiary rights as per letters a) to f).

4. In the context of section 2, the Author further grants the publishing company, for the duration of the primary right, all rights administered by collecting companies (particularly the VG WORT collecting society) under their statutes, collection agreements or distribution plans for joint registration with the respective collecting companies. Collection agreements already concluded shall remain unaffected by this.
5. If the author intends to participate in the **Open Access Model** of the Schlütersche publishing company (Schlütersche Verlagsgesellschaft) in the "Berliner und Münchener Tierärztliche Wochenschrift", in a separate agreement the author will be given the right to publish his/her article across the world on submission of the original publication/source and date.
6. Placing the article on the author's own homepage or in institutional and disciplinary repositories is only permitted after a period of 12 months after the original publication has been published.

Exclusion of Liability, Safekeeping Period

1. The author accepts that the publishing company assumes no liability whatsoever for any damage in the event of loss of the manuscript or parts thereof. This also applies if such damage arises in the course of electronic data transmission, provided that the publishing company is not responsible for such damage or loss.
2. The author shall retain a complete copy of the manuscript in his files.
3. The manuscript shall be destroyed three months after publication. Only copies explicitly designated as unique copies shall be returned on request. However, the publishing company shall assume no liability.
4. Inasmuch as the author is responsible for errors in the journal article published / made available for online download by third parties (e.g. errors in content, errors in meaning, misprints or errors which may have arisen in the course of machine-readable recording, electronic storage or distribution by remote data transmission), he shall indemnify the publishing company against warranty claims and claims for damage which third parties may bring against the publishing company.

Decisive law, reservation of rights

1. Amendments and supplements to the contract require written form. No verbal collateral agreements have been made.
2. If individual provisions in the contract are void or ineffective, this does not affect the validity of the other provisions. The parties to the contract are then obliged to replace the void or ineffective provision with a provision which most closely approaches the void or ineffective provision in terms of its commercial and legal meaning.
3. The law of the Federal Republic of Germany applies in addition, particularly the German Civil Code, the Copyright Act and the Publishing Act.
4. The place of performance of the contract and the place of jurisdiction for both parties is the publishing company's main office (Hanover).
